ABOLITION OF DOMESTIC RATES ETC (SCOTLAND) BILL COMMUNITY CHARGE REGISTRATION: EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION

In your letter of 7 November to Willie Whitelaw, you proposed that social security records should be made available for the provision of information in connection with community charge registration. I am sorry not to have responded earlier. However, I understand that this does not form part of the Bill and it is therefore not too late for comments.

I can see considerable problems about your proposal. My Local Offices will be very heavily engaged next year and in 1988 in implementing the social security reforms. We must not add anything to their task which would put the successful launch of the reforms at risk. I believe that the proposal that we should supply information to help set up the community charge register could do this. It would cause a considerable amount of extra work for my Local Offices: they are not computerised at present and lists of names and addresses would have to be specially prepared for registration purposes. I am not clear how much our records could in any event add to that which would be available from other sources. I therefore am not able at this stage to support the proposal.
