I would just like to add that this formulation seems to me quite consistent with the agreement we have reached (in our discussions on arrangements for the 1989 public expenditure Survey) that we shall need to decide on a total funding "envelope" for local authorities, including RSG and NNDR, before the NNDR figure will be known. The reality is, therefore, that RSG will vary inversely with the NNDR, one component of which will be Government contributions in lieu. I do not think, however, that we should hesitate to acknowledge that publicly if we are asked. It would be irrational to take our decisions on the total funding requirements of local authorities on any other basis. I believe that local authorities themselves would expect and accept this.
