**COMMUNITY CHARGES: STANDARD SPENDING ASSESSMENTS**

Thank you for your letter of 12 September to David Hunt in response to the letter of 21 August to John MacGregor.

I appreciate that assessments for the single service Fire and Civil Service Defence Authorities need careful handling but I had hoped that the extensive work of officials from both our Departments in consultation with the Local Authority Associations, had produced an acceptable solution. I accept, however, that the situation has changed very recently and that Mr Clarkson's plans give greater emphasis to the need to have careful regard to the position in London.


In the light of this, officials have considered all the possibilities again and have come up with a formula based on the following indicators:-

- Population (36%), fire and false alarm calls (40%), ward weighted density (18%), category A risk areas (2%)

This formulation is exemplified in column 3 of the attached table. It will help with your concern over London's position, whilst also giving all the Metropolitan FCDs, except South Yorkshire, a higher assessment than at present. It has already been discussed with your officials who have seen the results in more detail.

I hope that you will be able to support the inclusion of the new option in the proposed package of SSAs. I should add that the alternative which you put forward of separate control totals for the FCDAs and the shires would not be acceptable. It would lead to renewed pressure for similar divisions for other blocks - notably the large and diffuse "other services block" - which would be difficult to resist. If we were driven down this road we would very quickly lose the advantages of simplification which we have been striving to achieve. On the use of establishments, there are difficulties at present in defending the figures we would need to have suitable assurances from your Department that the establishments are appropriate for each authority. But I certainly accept that this is something that we might look at as a possibility in the longer term.

I would be grateful if you could confirm, by the end of this week, that you find our revised proposal acceptable. I am copying this letter to all members of E(LG) and to Sir Robin Butler.
